

******IMPORTANT NOTICE******

NEW POLICY: Air Canada Groups traveling with Ski Equipment

***Note: Air Canada has implemented a new procedure for all Groups traveling with sporting equipment (ski boots, skis, snowboards).**

All ski equipment must be pre-registered prior to departure to avoid excess baggage charges applicable by Air Canada for non-registry travelers.

Starting Dec. 12, 2007 for travel on or after Jan. 7, 2008, all customers traveling with sporting equipment will be asked to register their items in advance of travel. Customers who elect not to pre-register their sporting equipment are subject to the applicable excess baggage charges at the airport. (The fee for each excess baggage piece is \$125CA for travel within North America and \$225CA for International travel).

Using this form, please provide an itemized list of equipment, including items which **DO NOT** meet the standard allowance.

STANDARD BAGGAGE REQUIREMENTS for ski & snowboard travelers!

*Two bags (1pc suitcase & 1pc sport equipment), each piece not exceeding an overall dimension of 158cm (62 inches) or weighing more than 23kg (50lbs). *Groups will be responsible for any excess baggage fees over the above free allowance.

Skis, Boots & Poles or Snowboard and Boots – Considered as 1 piece of baggage! (Skis and poles or snowboard must be packaged in a rigid and/or hard-shell container) Individual items if packed separately are: one pair of skis (snow), one set of poles, one snowboard, one pair of boots, one pair of skates, or a single slalom. Skis and poles or snowboard must be packaged in a rigid and/or hard-shell container specifically designed for shipping. If otherwise packaged, the item(s) will only be accepted with a limited release form (to be signed at check-in), releasing Air Canada of liability. The excess piece fee is waived for a pair of boots if carried as a single, separate piece when carried along with other related sports equipment such as skis or a snowboard. The oversize fee is waived for the ski bag/container. From January 7, 2008 onward, the above mentioned fees will only be waived if the equipment was registered before check-in at the airport. Customers are subject to all applicable overweight fees as well as all applicable excess piece and oversize fees not waived above.

EXCEPTIONS:

The excess piece fee is waived for a pair of ski boots or snowboard boots (when carried as a single, separate piece and when carried along with other related sports equipment such as skis or snowboard)*

ANY PIECE WEIGHING IN EXCESS OF 70LBS (32KG) OR EXCEEDING 80 INCHES (203 CM) IN TOTAL DIMENSIONS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AS BAGGAGE. ALTERNATE SHIPPING ARRANGEMENTS WILL NEED TO BE MADE BY THE GROUP (IE: AIR CANADA CARGO OR OTHER SHIPPING COMPANY)
